way most orchids are cultivated. Many species can be induced to thrive in pots on a bench, but there are significant holdouts that demand special treatment. These include the many types of orchids that send their leafy growths upward but their flowers sideways or downward, those where the vegetative growth extends in the wrong direction for pot culture or otherwise

defies containment, and still others that assert their epiphytic nature by refusing to grow well unless their roots are exposed to air and/or light.
Accommodating the needs of these special cases can help the grower maintain a healthier and more diverse

collection.

The presentation will offer a look at a sampling of orchid species that benefit from alternatives to traditional pot culture, followed by a brief demonstration and discussion of cultural techniques. A handout with information about sources
