### **Show Off Your Plants**

Shows are the time to really show off your plants. I know that early November isn't the best time for orchid blooms but hopefully we can scrounge up enough for a good display.

- \* Plants must be free of pests. It is particularly embarrassing to bring a nice plant to the show but to have it turned away due to the presence of bugs that you didn't see at home.
- \* Plants should be in bloom, or be varieties known for their foliage (Neofinetias, Jewel orchids etc.). Stake the blooms if needed, clean the leaves if needed. Basically make them presentable.
- \* Make the pot (if it has one) presentable. Put plants in plastic pots in a decorative container, clay pots are OK if they are not covered with

- water scale, algae or otherwise unsightly.
- \* Plants don't have to have a tag, but it is much better if they do.
- \* Bring the plants to the show/market on Thursday afternoon, before 3:30PM. If you can't make Thursday afternoon, be there by 8:30 on Friday morning.
- \* Pick your plants up at 4PM on Saturday.

## **Sell Your Plants**

If your orchid garden or greenhouse is overflowing, dividing and/or selling some of your plants at the fall show is a good way to make room for more orchids! Or if others have envied some of your plants at "show and tell" maybe you could make a little money by dividing that specimen. Members (only members please) of COS are encouraged to bring plants from their collections to sell. Here are a few guidelines for sales:

- 1. Plants should be disease and pest free.
- 2. Please fill out the COS Member Plant List in duplicate with each of the plants you are bringing,
- 2a. Put your name in the box for "Seller ID", if you are donating your plants to COS, put COS in the "Seller ID" column.
- 2b. Ignore the "Seller Code" at the top of the page.
- 3. For each plant, fill out the Plant Tags. Attach it to the orchid mount or pot with tape.
- 4. Give us a copy of your plant list on Thursday when you bring your orchids and we will check them in. You keep your copy.
- 5. COS will keep 25% of each sale as a

- part of our fundraiser. Price your plants accordingly, but remember that affordable plants sell first. Volunteers who will be at the sales table will not change prices on your plants, so if your plant is not selling, you may want to stop by the table during the show to change the price.
- 6. Plants can be brought to the church (show location) on Thursday afternoon, November 6th. If you cannot bring them until Friday, we will set them out for sale in the order as they are received. You will need to pick up any unsold plants at 4PM on Saturday.
- You can sell orchids, bromeliads, succulents, carnivorous plants, or other exotics that you may have around.

### Friday, Nov. 7

- **10:00 AM Ten Easy Orchids to Try** Want to branch out and buy something other than a Phalaenopsis, but not sure what you can grow? This is the discussion for you.
- **11:30 AM Repotting Phals** When it's done blooming, don't throw it out! We'll show you how to refresh the bark, examine the roots and keep your Phalaenopsis healthy so it'll bloom again.
- **1:00 PM How to Keep Orchids Alive** Expert grower Dennis Olivas shares his wealth of orchid care knowledge in this general presentation about keeping plants thriving.

#### Saturday, Nov. 8

- **10:00 AM Dividing and Repotting Cymbidiums** Cyms grow so well here that they can become massive. Then what? Well, you can make more than one plant out of 'em! We'll show you how.
- **11:00 AM Displaying and Mounting Orchids** Not everything belongs in a pot! There are lots of ways to mount plants on bark, cork or other interesting surfaces, and we'll show you how easy it is to be creative and show off your orchids.

# The Happy Hobbyist: Fighting Bugs

I 'inherited' some Phalaenopsis this fall, only to discover the pots were full of tiny ants – ugh! And earlier this year with my indoor orchids, I had to deal with an outbreak of mealybugs. But if you've got plants, you've got pests – and if you know how to fight them, you can take this in stride and not have to sacrifice your orchids.

Pests are the primary reason to quarantine any new orchid you bring home. Keep it away from others in your collection for at least two weeks – some people say even longer – to make sure it doesn't have bugs or a disease.



To deal with the ants, I set the plants in a well-ventilated plastic box with a small, enclosed container of liquid ant bait. I placed the box outside, far away from any other plants. After two weeks, the bait container was full – and the orchids were fine. I inspected and repotted each of them with clean, ant-free bark. Mission accomplished!

The mealybugs were a clue that my indoor plants weren't getting enough air circulation. They spread quickly among plants in close proximity and don't always look like bugs, but bits of cotton stuck in the crevices of spikes and leaves. I fight cotton with cotton – 70% isopropyl alcohol on a cotton swab – to kill mealybugs and remove their stringy, white residue. I sometimes use Safer brand Insect-Killing Soap. Mealybugs are a type of scale, so this method also works for other scale infestations.

And of course, I remove the buggy plants from contact with others and check them often until I'm absolutely sure they're pest-free again, which can take a month or so, just to be safe.

Pest control can be a hassle, but if you really examine your plants during weekly watering, you can spot problems before they become major – and you won't have to toss the plant out!

# Minutes of the COS BoD meeting September 24, 2025

Amanda Nixon called the ZOOM meeting to order at 4:05. Present besides Amanda were: Irene, Cathy, Peter, Carolyn, Chris, Sonya, Albert, Anna, Janette.

The minutes from the August meeting were read and approved.

Janette gave her treasurer's report: Expenses were the BBQ plant table, \$281, the BBQ meat, \$90. Income was \$176 from the plant table raffle.

Carolyn gave the Vice Presidents report: Brandon Dichochea from the Santa Cruz Orchid Society will give a repotting demonstration of two of his orchids and talk about growing cool weather orchids. We met him at the 2024 Greenhouse Tour here and again at the SCOS this summer.

Amanda read Kathie Ritter's report for the Fall Market naming all the committees and updates on the vendors. She has added Johnny Artiago (succulents and cactus) and Alejandro Hayes with perennials. She will ask Sonya to call around to members for contributions to the Society Display table of blooming orchids that John will install. She asked that we contact her if we have any problems. She is working on a solution to block the wind from coming in down the outdoor church

corridor.

Peter described his work for flyers to go out in local businesses for the Fall Market. He is printing them and giving to us for distribution. Cathy will distribute them at the Marina Tree and Garden seed exchange on October 5th. Peter discussed the website contacts page for listing personal information. Everyone agreed names and offices only. He is simplifying the website and asked for suggestions.

Peter also told us about his work on membership and the Mail Chimp. The Board discussed receiving dues traditionally at the Fall Market but anytime will be accepted.

Cathy helped us set up dates for the 2026 meetings which were decided as follows: January 3; February 7; March 7; April 4; May 2; June 6; August 1; October 3, November Market 6 and 7; December 5, Holiday Party. The July event and the Fall Pot Luck will be determined at a later date since they do not involve the Church scheduling.

Anna will be doing her twice-yearly table at the October meeting. All orchid and any other sellable items should be brought to the meeting to raise funds for the group.

Albert stated he would like to see more social events such as happy hour, hikes (such as wild orchid hunting) where we could mingle and enjoy members.

Members were interested in this.

Irene asked if the BBQ could be renamed Fall Pot Luck and the Christmas Party could be renamed Holiday Party. It was voted on and approved. Regular activities would not
